McKay High School re-establishes FFA chapter, expands program and invites community support

The FFA Organization guides students through developing their potential for premier leadership, personal growth, and career success while recognizing this as an integral part of agricultural education. FFA covers all aspects of agriculture from production farming, agribusiness and forestry to biotechnology, marketing and food processing.

It wasn't that long ago that the FFA program at McKay High School in Salem was decommissioned and most everything was sold. When the program was recently reinstated in 2015, the new Ag Teacher/FFA Advisor, Gerald Hosler, had nothing more than an empty shop and his own passion for agriculture to welcome his new students.

Over the last few years, Mr. Hosler has done a great job getting the program back on track. He resurrected the greenhouse and purchased some equipment. More importantly, he generated a lot of enthusiasm with a large group of students that do not come from an agricultural background.

He has provided agriculture education to over 1,300 McKay high school students and has approximately 30 students actively involved in the FFA program. He is expected to reach many more students in the 2019-2020 school year when Salem-Keizer FFA

becomes fully integrated with the district wide Career and Technical Education Center program.

While the school property has 6-acres for Mr. Hosler to develop a crops program, he lacks some of the necessary equipment. The crops program is going to reach students across the Salem-Keizer school district in a massive way. Mr. Hosler is developing a Farm to Fork program that will supply fresh produce directly to the Salem-Keizer Culinary Arts students. It will also include significant outreach activities to middle and elementary school students educating them about where their food comes from.

Will you consider supporting this program that is so valuable to our youth and agricultural community? Ways you can offer support include serving as a guest speaker, opening your place of business up for a field trip opportunity, and providing in kind donations or cash for the following items:

Cap and Trade Hearings Wrap; Hundreds of New Bills Dropped

The Roadshow on Cap and Trade concluded on Saturday, March 2nd with the final hearing in Bend. Thank you to all the farmers and ranchers who showed up and made our voices heard across the state!

That week was also the deadline for legislators to drop bills prior to it counting against their session limit, so OFB saw a significant number of new bills on everything from CAFOs to pesticides and labor to wildlife management, bringing the total number of bills dropped so far to over 2,360.

OFB is tracking almost 550 of these proposals for a potential impact on agriculture. While the number of bills introduced will begin to slow down, there will be new bills introduced throughout the session that OFB will track.

With the deadline for bills to move out of their current chamber a little over a month away, OFB's government affairs staff is working nonstop to ensure that legislators understand the impact of each of these proposals and to try to minimize the negative effects on agriculture.

As legislative activity heats up over the next month, please be checking your email regularly, ensuring your neighbors are signed up for OFB's legislative updates and action alerts, and writing your legislators and legislative committees about proposals that could impact your operation!

Marion County Farm Bureau Scholarship Opportunities

Marion County Farm Bureau is excited to announce scholarship applications are now available on their website!

The <u>Scott Miller Memorial Scholarship</u> will award scholarships up to \$2,500 in 2019.

Scott Miller was the fourth generation of his family to farm on their land in Woodburn. He farmed row crops and fresh market produce and was on the Marion County Farm Bureau board of directors. He tragically died when the tractor he was driving was rear ended by a vehicle in 2014.

To be considered for the Scott Miller Scholarship:

- 1. The applicant must be a family member of a voting or supporting member of Marion County Farm Bureau.
- 2. The applicant must be a graduating high school senior or a full-time freshman, sophomore, or junior at an accredited college or trade school.
- 3. The applicant must be from Marion County.

In 2019 the <u>Mary Petzel Memorial Scholarship</u> will award scholarships up to \$2,500.

Mary Petzel was the long-time secretary of Marion County Farm Bureau and was recognized for her disciplined approach to *all* aspects of the Farm Bureau. She also served as a member of the Oregon Farm Bureau Women's Advisory Council. Her family farms in the Brooks/Gervais area.

To be considered for the Mary Petzel Scholarship:

- 1. The applicant must be a family member of a voting or supporting member of Marion County Farm Bureau, **or** enrolled in FFA **or** 4-H, **or** majoring in Agriculture.
- 2. The applicant must be a graduating high school senior or a fulltime freshman, sophomore, or junior at an accredited college or trade school

Application deadline is Friday, May 3rd, 2019.
