Get to know the Oregon Agricultural Trust

Marion County is the heart of the Mid-Willamette Valley and home to the most fertile farm ground in the state. Upwards of 200+ different crop and livestock products are grown here, from grasses to wine grapes, wheat to hops, berries, vegetables, nursery, Christmas trees and livestock.

These all color the landscape that many farmers also call home. Maintaining farm ground in production is a high priority and one that takes concerted and collaborative effort among producers and service providers alike.

Oregon Agricultural Trust (OAT) is a nonprofit statewide land trust that partners with farmers and ranchers to protect agricultural lands for the benefit of Oregon's economy, communities, and landscapes.

The goal is to address the interrelated challenges of the loss of ag land to fragmentation and development, and the difficulty of passing ag land to the next generation



of farmers and ranchers.

While OAT serves the entire state, we focus on four regions: the north coast, mid- & south-Willamette Valley, mid-Columbia, and southeast Oregon.

Through a newly launched education program, OAT provides landowner education and support on succession planning, easements, and connecting with successors.

In addition, we work with service providers such as attorneys, accountants, and government employees to become proficient in farm and ranch succession planning and supporting easement transactions.
