### County Transportaton Safety Action Plan Needs You

Marion County Public Works is creating a Transportation Safety Action Plan (TSAP) to create strategies for improvements to reduce the amount of serious and fatal crashes that occur on our rural roadways.

Over the next year and a half, Public Works will be having a variety of Public Open House Meetings and Stakeholder Meetings to gather information on "the what and where" safety concerns exist within the county to all who use our roadways.

Public Works is inviting farm bureau

members to be part of a Stakeholders group to provide invaluable information through the lense of farm equipment operators to help form the development of the TSAP.

The first Stakeholders Meeting will likely be early September to introduce the project and discuss ideas. The date is still being determined.

We often get asked the question "What is the value of my Farm Bureau membership?"

There are the obvious responses, a major one being our various Marion County Farm Bureau classes and workshops. In 2023, Voting and Supporting MCFB members were eligible for 2 free spots at our annual 1st Aid/CPR classes and also invited, at no cost, to our "Succession Planning for Producers" workshop held with other local organizations. If you took advantage of those opportunities, your membership paid for itself! If you have any suggestions for future workshops/classes, that you think would benefit our agricultural community, please let us know.

But the biggest value of your membership is having a unified voice for agriculture. Among our over 6,600 Oregon Farm Bureau members, collectively we raise Oregon's 225+ agricultural commodities. All farm and ranch sizes - from 10 acres to 10,000 acres - are welcome and invited to join, as are all the various farming practices including organic, sustainable, and conventional. Public policy has a huge impact on our ability to do our jobs and remain profitable and sustainable. OFB has a professional staff that works tirelessly to advocate for Farm Bureau members in the political, regulatory, legal, and public arenas. As a grassroots organization, the input and participation of our members is integral to our success. Thank you to our members who take the time to engage – it does make a difference.

We have 13 directors on our MCFB board and over 600 voting and supporting members who are passionate about current issues and the long-term future of agriculture in Marion County. What do we talk about at meetings? Issues of importance at a local/county level that our board of directors, MCFB members and others bring to our attention. Issues that we think are also important at a statewide level are sent on to our OFB State Board and our OFB State Committees for further discussion and action.

At our recent August meeting we had a 2023 legislative update including information on HB 3379 (which would have removed the requirement that farm machinery and equipment be tangible personal property). We reviewed our ongoing Spray Drift meetings held in conjunction with ODA and Oregonians for Food and Shelter and discussed reaching out to the new Marion County Sheriff. We heard a report on protesters harassing family farmers and were updated on regulating popup roadside vendors on county right of ways. We also discussed the concerns of some farmers in Marion County who are struggling to make ends meet. This past year we've had guest speakers who provided information on rural internet, biosolids and specialty seed crops. Other guest speakers were looking for input on bridges and rural roads in Marion County and help in reaching out to our members with information to keep our 1st responders safe. It's gratifying that we are the "go to" organization for information on agriculture in Marion County.

On a personal note, wine grape harvest is coming up quickly. The high temperatures and duration of the high temperatures caused some berry damage. Winemakers don't want us to bring in fruit with a cooked fruit flavor so we're dropping those clusters on the ground. A small crop always gets smaller (big crops seem to get bigger). But as we always say, the quality this year looks fabulous and the 2023 vintage will be a great one (we grape growers are always optimists!) Hope your harvests are fabulous as well! Cheers!
