Membership Dues

Your annual membership dues include membership in your county Farm Bureau, Oregon Farm Bureau, and American Farm Bureau. Voting and supporting member dues include a subscription to Oregon Farm Bureau News, the Oregon's Bounty Calendar, and the Oregon's Bounty Farm Stand Guide. You may also subscribe to various online updates provided by Oregon Farm Bureau. Dues are not tax deductible as charitable contributions but may qualify as a business expense. Consult your tax professional for advice.

OFB President's Club

The OFB President's Club represents financial support for all the areas below. Contributions of \$75 or more above dues are allocated in equal parts to the OFB Memorial Scholarship Fund, OFB Foundation for Education, OFB Legal Foundation, and the OFB PAC (Political Action Committee). The foundations and scholarships are part of 501c3 charitable organizations and are tax deductible as allowed by law. PAC contributions may qualify you for a \$50 per person or a \$100 per married couple Oregon state tax credit, meaning a contribution could potentially cost you nothing. Consult your tax professional for advice.

OFB Political Action Committee (PAC)

The Oregon Farm Bureau PAC funds are used in elections to support candidates and ballot measure positions beneficial to Oregon's farm and ranch families. Policies and decisions for the PAC are made by an all-farmer/rancher board of directors. PAC contributions qualify you for a \$50 per person or \$100 per married couple Oregon state tax credit, meaning a contribution could cost you nothing. Consult your tax professional for advice. PAC contributions are not charitable deductible contributions for federal tax purposes.

Oregon Agricultural Education Foundation

The Education Foundation is a 501c3 tax deductible charitable organization. It operates a scholarship program, Oregon's Century Farm and Ranch program, the ag and natural resources leadership academy REAL Oregon, and the K-12 teacher graduate credit program Summer Ag Institute where teachers get an in-depth ag and natural resource immersion experience and lesson plans to incorporate into their classroom curriculum. Teachers earn 3 graduate credits from Oregon State University, the equivalent of 60 professional development units.

Oregon Farm Bureau Legal Education

The Oregon Farm Bureau Legal Foundation is a 501c3 tax deductible charitable organization that advances OFB Policy through litigation, intervention in lawsuits, and friend-of-the-court briefs in cases that impact Oregon's farm and ranch families.

Nearly 7,000 families strong, Oregon Farm Bureau is the state's largest agricultural membership organization, established at the county level in 1919 and state level in 1932. Delegates from all County Farm Bureaus gather each December to adopt the OFB Policy Book, which guides our public policy advocacy through legislation, agency work, and in the courts.
